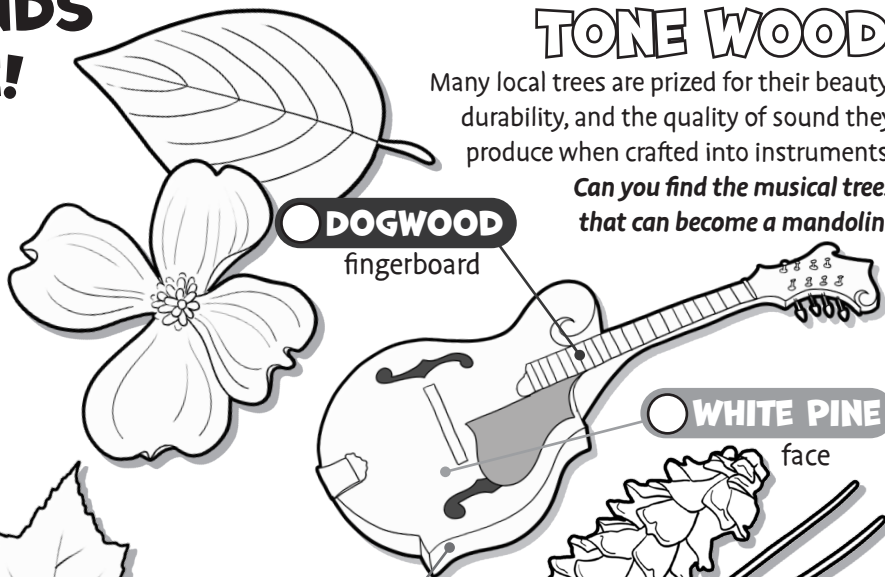
## EXPLORE THE SOUNDS OF THE BLUE RIDGE!

Can you find the musical trees that can become a mandolin?

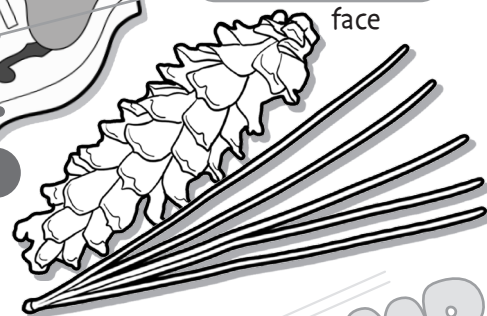

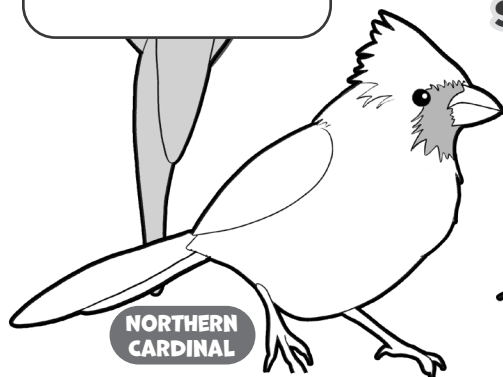

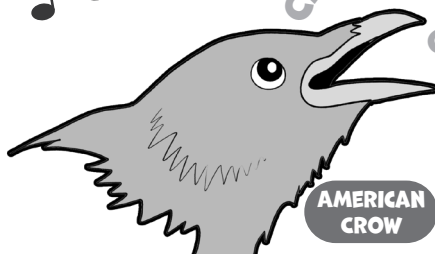

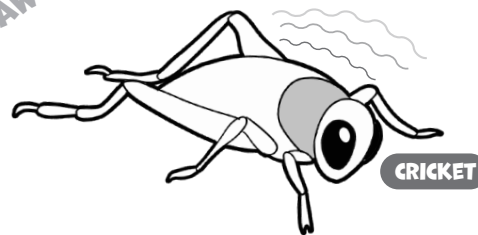
