
## **Natural Friends**

# A Friendship that Helped Build America

Seth Bullock and Theodore Roosevelt met on the Dakota plains in 1892. It was the beginning of a friendship that would last the rest of their lives and shape the future of the country.

## **Famous Friends**

Roosevelt would go on to become President of the United States and Seth Bullock would become one of the most famous sheriffs in the West. Throughout the years they camped and hunted together. Roosevelt's kids spent summer's on Bullock's ranch.

They bonded over their shared interest in preserving wild places in the Western Frontier. Together, they played key roles in creating National Parks and Monuments—like Devils Tower, Jewel Cave, and Wind Cave—and the Black Hills National Forest.



# **Legacy of Friendship**

Seth Bullock constructed the tower to honor his longtime friendship with Theodore Roosevelt. Today, the tower is an enduring symbol of a friendship that helped preserve a vanishing wilderness in the West. New generations of people have come together to make sure the tower stands long into the future.

Can you find ways that people have preserved the tower?

National Register of Historic Places Plaque - This designation helps provide resources to continue preservation. Can you find the date when it was officially listed?
<b>Roof</b> - The tower was built without a roof, but it helps protect the structure from rain, snow, and ice. How is it different than the rest of the tower?
Hand rails - The stairs are steep and fairly difficult to climb.  The rail makes it safer and more accessible for more people.  Why do you think it is important that people have the opportunity to climb the tower?
<b>Stone</b> - Touch the walls. Thanks to the work of preservationists, these walls are in the same condition as whe they were built. What do you think Bullock and Roosevelt would think if they saw the tower still standing today?
