



The Orchard is next to Altapass, the lowest pass through the mountains for 100 miles. Who or what do you think has used Altapass to travel through the mountains?



Can you hear or see the train? If so, count the number of cars you see or the whistles you hear.

For the last 100 years, trains have traveled through Altapass 24 times per day. How many times does a train pass through in one week?

The Orchard is a highway for birds! Many different species of birds migrate (travel) through the area in spring and fall. Can you hear or see a bird? Describe what you hear or see.



Did you know every flower can become a fruit, and every fruit was once a flower? This is because when a flower is pollinated it transforms into a fruit, in order to produce more seeds. Can you find a flower? What color is it?




There are forty apple varieties here at the Orchard. How many can you find?

The Virginia Beauty apple is a local favorite. It has a deep red color with a yellow "bonnet" at the top.



The York Imperial apple used to have a different name-"Lop-Eared Johnson." Look for a red "crooked" apple.



What kinds of apples do you like? (sweet or tart, crunchy or soft, red or green)



What foods do you like to eat with apples in them?



Bees, butterflies, and other pollinators fly from flower to flower to collect nectar (food). While doing that, a pollinator carries pollen (yellow powder) from one flower to the next.





## Monarch Butterfly

Millions of monarch butterflies migrate through this area every fall to their overwintering area thousands of miles away in Mexico. What is the furthest you have ever traveled?
